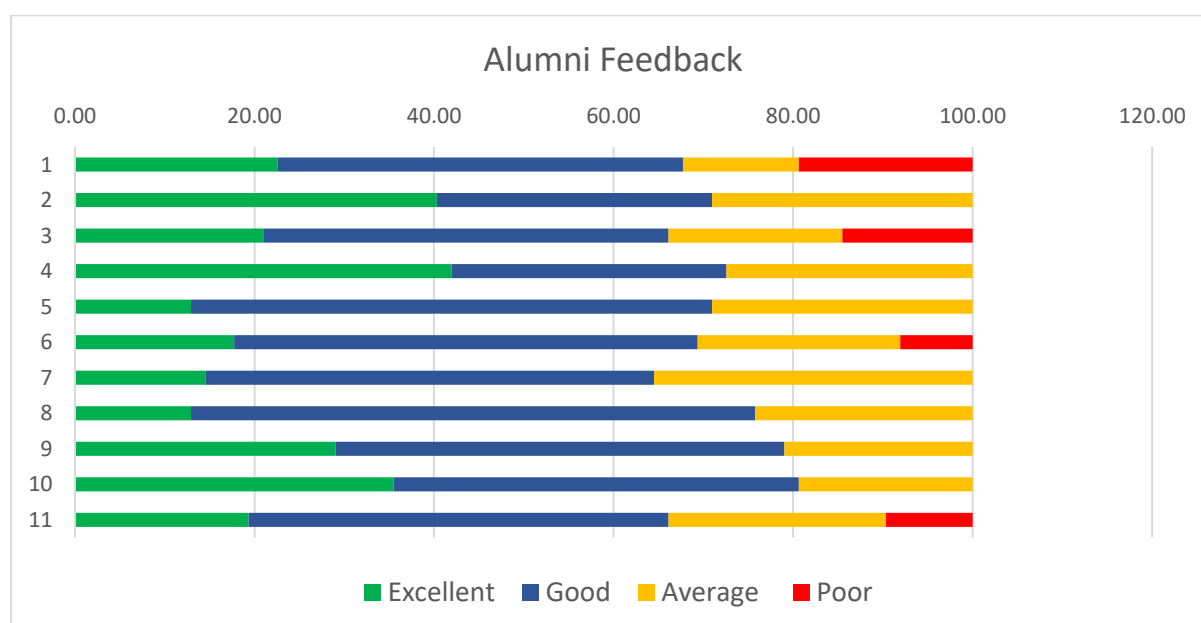

- C) 8.06 % students have given poor remark for the Institute training activities that help in getting jobs?
- D) Quality of effective 35.48 % students would like to have improvement in the effective teaching process

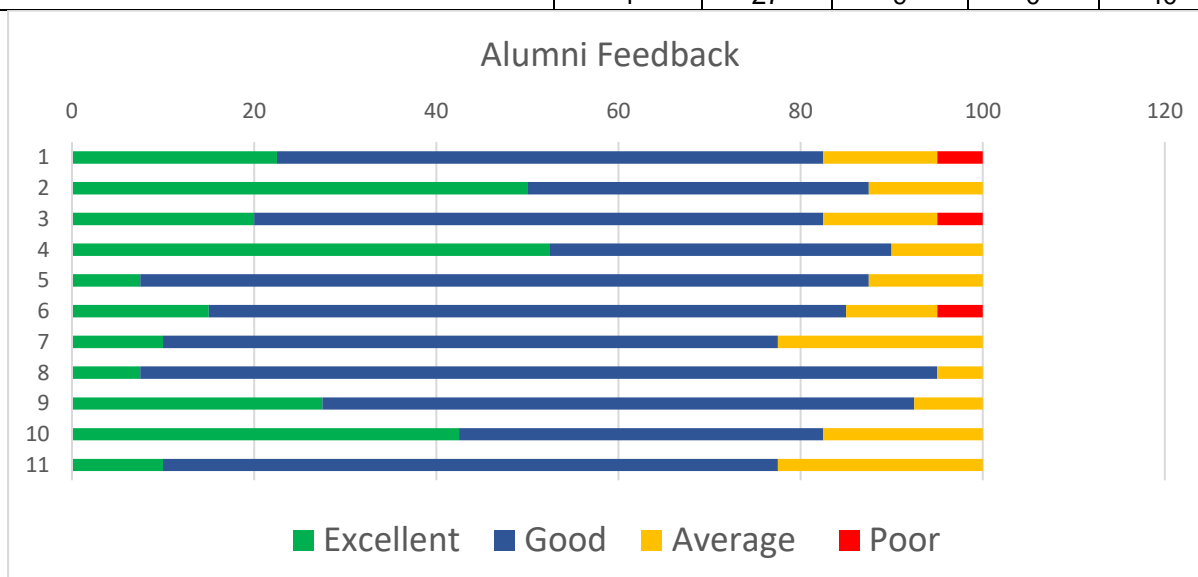
